This report, prepared pursuant to section 20(5) of the Social Services Law (SSL), concerns: A report made to the New York Statewide Central Register of Child Abuse and Maltreatment (SCR) involving the death of a child.
The death of a child for whom child protective services has an open case.
The death of a child whose care and custody or custody and guardianship has been transferred to an authorized agency.
The death of a child for whom the local department of social services has an open preventive service case.

The Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) is mandated by section 20 of the SSL to investigate or cause for the investigation of the cause and circumstances surrounding the death, review such investigation, and prepare and issue a fatality report in regard to the categories of deaths noted above involving a child, except where a local or regional fatality review team issues a report, as authorized by law.

Such report must include: the cause of death; the identification of child protective or other services provided or actions taken regard to such child and child's family; any extraordinary or pertinent information concerning the circumstances of the child's death; whether the child or the child's family received assistance, care or services from the social services district prior to the child's death; any action or further investigation undertaken by OCFS or the social services district since the child's death; and as appropriate, recommendations for local or state administrative or policy changes.

This report contains no information that would identify the deceased child, his or her siblings, the parent, parents, or other persons legally responsible for the child, and any members of the deceased child's household.

By statute, this report will be forwarded to the social services district, chief county executive officer, chairperson of the local legislative body of the county where the child died and the social services district that had legal custody of the child, if different. Notice of the issuance of this report will be sent to the Speaker of the Assembly and the Temporary President of the Senate of the State of New York.

This report may <u>only</u> be disclosed to the public by OCFS pursuant to section 20(5) of the SSL. It may be released by OCFS only after OCFS has determined that such disclosure is not contrary to the best interests of the deceased child's siblings or other children in the household.

OCFS' review included an examination of actions taken by individual caseworkers and supervisors within the social services district and agencies under contract with the social services district. The observations and recommendations contained in this report reflect OCFS' assessment and the performance of these agencies.

Presenting Information

An SCR report alleged on the morning of 9/10/20, the 10-month-old child passed away. The father had the child in the bed with him because the child was having a tantrum. The father left the room, but checked on the child between 9:30 and 10:00 AM and the child appeared to be fine. The father checked on the child a second time just before 10:55 AM and the child was face down on the bed. The child appeared to be lifeless and had a small amount of vomit near him. The father called 911. The child was transported to the hospital by EMS. The child was later pronounced deceased at the hospital. The father did not have an explanation for the child's death. The mother was at work at the time of the incident and her role was unknown.

Executive Summary

On 9/10/20, the Erie County Department of Social Services (ECDSS) received an SCR report regarding the death of the 10-month-old male child. At the time of the child's death he resided with his mother and father. The parents had no other children and they had no SCR history.

ECDSS conducted a joint investigation with law enforcement and they learned that on the morning of 9/10/20, the mother left for work around 8:15 AM and the child was awake and alert at that time. After the mother left, the father laid in the adult bed with the child and gave him a bottle. The parents were babysitting a friend's 4-year-old child and she was in the living room. The 10-month-old child fell asleep on the bed and the father went into the living room with the 4-year-old child. The father returned to the bedroom to check on the child around 10:50 AM and he discovered that the child had rolled over onto his stomach and he had vomited. The father picked up the child and realized he was not breathing. He brought the child into the living room and he called 911. The father performed CPR until first responders arrived and took over. The child was transported to the hospital via ambulance where resuscitative measures continued until 11:55 AM, at which time he was pronounced deceased.

An autopsy was performed, and the ME reported that there were no suspicious marks or bruises observed on the child and x-rays showed there were no fractures or trauma. The child was found to have posterior congestion (lung congestion) and subgaleal and petechial hemorrhage on the face and lungs. Further testing was required, and the results were pending at the time this report was written. There had been no charges filed and the law enforcement investigation was ongoing pending the final autopsy results.

The parents' bedroom where the child was sleeping was assessed to be filled with clothing, garbage, toys and miscellaneous items completely covering the floor of the bedroom. Additionally, there were cleaning supplies, medications and beauty supplies throughout the home that were accessible to the child. ECDSS found some credible evidence to substantiate the allegation of Inadequate Guardianship against the parents due to the condition of the home. An administrative review found there was not a fair preponderance of evidence to support the allegation and it was overturned. ECDSS unsubstantiated the allegation of DOA/Fatality against the father as there was a lack of credible evidence that the father's actions or inactions caused the child's death. The parents were provided with information on grief services and the case was closed on 11/9/20.

LDSS Response

Within 24 hours of receipt of the SCR report ECDSS notified the DA's office of the child's death, conducted an SCR history search and they spoke to the source of the report, law enforcement, the ME's office, the pediatrician, the parents and the 4-year-old child and her mother.

Through interviews with the parents it was learned that the child was healthy and developmentally on target. They denied that the child had been injured and they had no explanation for the child's death. The parents reported that the child usually slept in a crib in a separate bedroom and he woke up every morning and spent time with the mother while she was getting ready for work. On the morning of 9/10/20, the child woke up as usual and he seemed happy and alert at that time. The child cried when it was time for the mother to leave so she made a bottle and she placed the child in the parents' bed with the father, who was awake. The parents had a queen-sized bed and they reported that they moved all the blankets and pillows away from the child, so he was just lying on the fitted sheet. The mother left for work around 8:15 AM.

The child drank his bottle and then he fell asleep on his back on the parents' bed. The father laid with the child for a while and he went into the living room when he heard the 4-year-old child was awake. The father saw the child roll onto his side before he left the room around 9:30 AM. The father played with the 4-year-old child in the living room and he did not hear any sounds coming from the bedroom. The father returned to the bedroom to check on the child around 10:50 AM and he discovered that the child was on his stomach with vomit on his face, and he was unresponsive. The father called 911 then he called the mother and told her the child was not breathing. A co-worker drove the mother home, and on the way, she contacted the 4-year-old child's mother to pick up the 4-year-old.

The 4-year-old child was assessed to be safe with her mother. The 4-year-old reported that the child was fine when he was sleeping but when he woke up, he wasn't feeling well, and he had to go in the ambulance. She did not report any concerns for the child or his parents. The 4-year-old's mother stated that the parents were friends of hers and they often babysat for her. She stated that the 4-year-old had been in the parents' home since 9/8/20. She had no concerns for the parents' care of either child. She said she was contacted by the mother to come and pick up her child and she arrived at the home around 11:15 AM. First responders were at the home and she was not allowed inside.

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First responders reported that there was a wet stain observed on the fitted sheet where the child had been sleeping. The blankets and pillows were pushed to one side of the bed and there were no items located on the bed near the stain. First responders expressed concern for the condition of the parents' bedroom. Law enforcement stated that there were no clear pathways in the bedroom and they were standing approximately a foot off the ground due to the clutter. EMS reported that the child had no pulse upon arrival and there was formula in the child's airway. First responders from EMS, law enforcement and the fire department denied any evidence of injury to the child. Hospital records stated that the child arrived with no pulse and resuscitation attempts were unsuccessful. Pediatrician records showed that the child was up to date with well child visits and immunizations. It was noted that he was healthy and there were no concerns.
